

## Other Services (Except Government) (102700)

The **Other Services (Except Government)** supersector is projected to add 1,454 jobs to the Arkansas labor market over the 2018-2020 projection period, an increase of 2.56 percent. Much of the growth in this supersector is likely to come from *Religious, Grantmaking, Civic, Professional, and Similar Organizations* with a gain of 1,355 jobs. Religious Organizations, which includes Churches, is predicted to add 1,131 to its workforce making the Top 10 in the state's Top 20 Growing Industries list. Business, Professional, Labor, Political, and Similar Organizations could see a drop of 63 jobs, making the state's Top 20 Declining Industries list.

The *Repair and Maintenance* subsector could see a 1.87 percent increase in jobs, or 423 new jobs during the projection period. Commercial and Industrial Machinery and Equipment (except Automotive and Electronic) Repair and Maintenance could see 114 additional jobs, while Electronic and Precision Equipment Repair and Maintenance is slated to increase employment by 6.49 percent.

*Personal and Laundry Services* is projected to experience a net gain of 86 jobs, an increase of 1.13 percent. Personal Care Services is estimated to have the brightest outlook leading this subsector with 56 new jobs. However, Drycleaning and Laundry Services could offset the gain with a decline of 44 jobs, or 1.92 percent of its workforce.


*Private Households* could see significant cuts in its workforce with a loss of 174 jobs, equivalent to 4.24 percent of its current employment making the Top 10 of the Top 20 Declining Industries list and also makes the Top 20 Fastest Declining Industries list.
